

Serger Stitches

1. 4-thread Overlock Stitch




Uses all 4 thread Used mostly for seaming

Tensions:

2. 3-Thread Overlock Stitch



Uses 3 threads

Tensions:

Used for seaming on super stretch fabric like Lycra, Overedge decorative stitch with specialty thread in the loopers


Use left needle for a wide seam and right needle for a narrow seam

Upper Looper Lower Looper Left needle or Right needle		



3. 3-Thread Flatlock

Tensions:




Uses 3 threads
Used for butting two pieces of fabric together for flat seams like raglan sleeves,
Decorative thread can be placed in the upper looper
Use left needle for a wide seam and right needle for a narrow seam

4. 3-Thread Wrapped (Rolled) Edge

Tensions:




Uses 3 threads
Used for finishing fabric edges with decorative thread in the upper looper
Can be used for serger pin tucks
Use right needle and disengage the stitch finger

Upper Looper Lower Looper Right needle			



5. 2-Thread Standard Edge






Uses 2 threads

Used to finish fabric edges before seaming with a sewing machine Use left needle for a wide seam and right needle for a narrow seam Use the 2 Thread converter (spreader)

Tensions: Lower Looper Right needle			



6. 2-Thread Wrapped (Rolled) Edge





Uses 2 threads Used as a decorative lightweight fabric edge finish Use the right needle for a fine edge Use the 2 Thread converter (spreader)

Tensions: Lower Loop Right needle	er e
