SKILL LEVEL: Beginner (Level 1)

SIZE: One Size

Finished Circumference About 19 in. (48.5 cm), will stretch to fit a range of sizes

Finished Height About 9 in. (23 cm)

MATERIALS

- 136-099 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Dry Tortugas
1 Ball (A)
- 136-126 Lion Brand Heartland Yarn: Sequoia
1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size J-10 (6 mm)
- Lion Brand Large-Eye Blunt Needles (Set of 6)

Heartland (Article #136). **Solids: 100% Acrylic*

***Tweeds:** 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 5oz/142g (251yd/230m)*

***Tweeds:** 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)*



GAUGE:

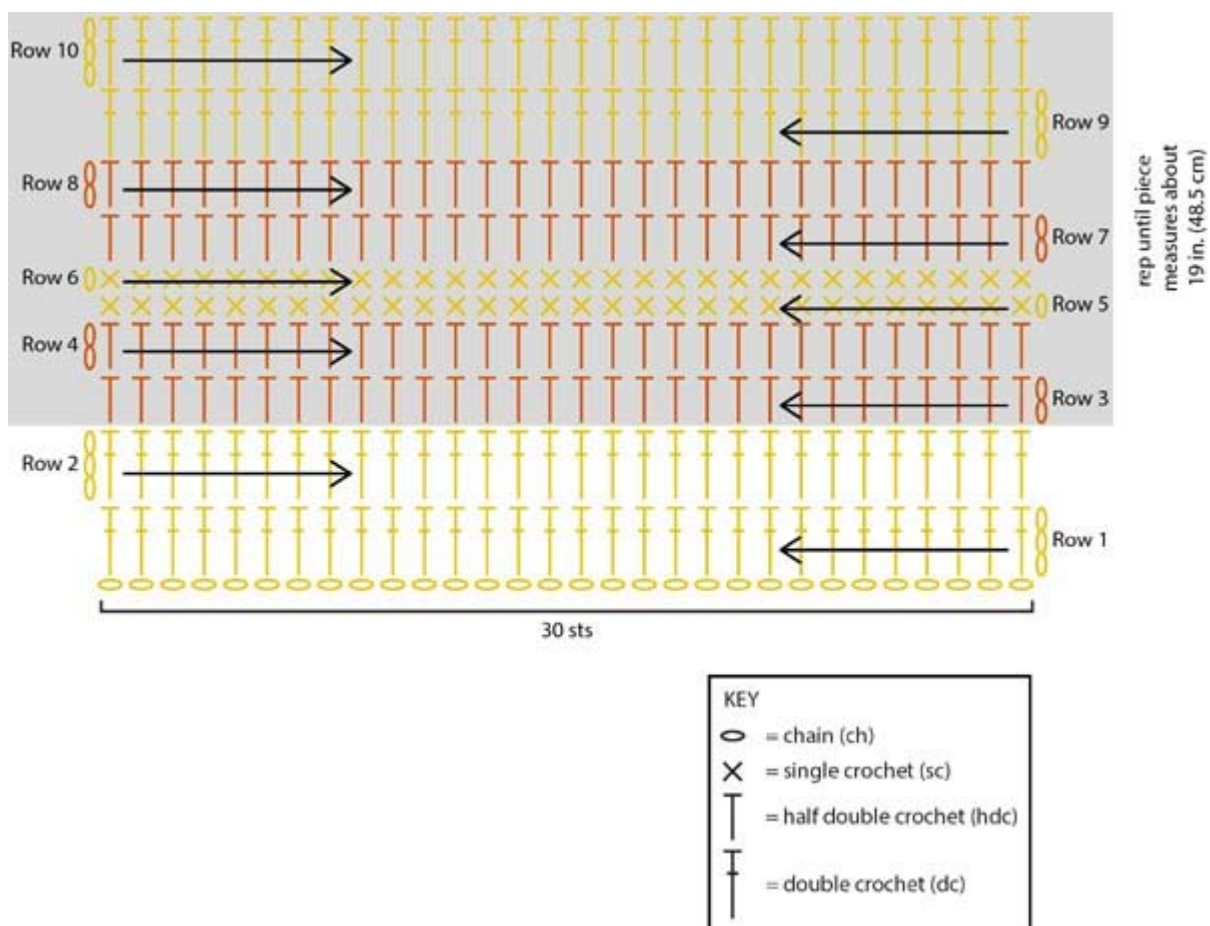
12 sts = about 4 in. (10 cm) over Rows 3-10.

When you match the gauge in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

NOTES:

1. Hat is worked in one piece, back and forth in rows.
2. The yarn color is changed on every other row to create stripes.
3. The Hat is easy to make, but we've provided a diagram to clarify the construction. Note that the diagram does not show all the rows that you will be working.
4. To change color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Do not fasten off old color until instructed. Carry color not in use up side of piece until next needed. The carried strands will be hidden when the Hat is seamed.
5. Short ends of the piece are sewn together to make a tube, then one end of the tube is gathered for the top of the Hat.



HAT

With A, ch 33.

Row 1: With A, dc in 4th ch from hook (the 3 skipped ch do not count as a st) and in each ch across – you will have 30 dc in this row.

Row 2: With A, ch 3 (does not count as a st), turn, dc in each st across and change to B in last st.

Rows 3 and 4: With B, ch 2 (does not count as a st), turn, hdc in each st across and change to A in last st of Row 4.

Rows 5 and 6: With A, ch 1 (does not count as a st), turn, sc in each st across and change to B in last st of Row 6.

Rows 7 and 8: With B, rep Rows 3 and 4 and change to A in last st of Row 8.

Rows 9 and 10: With A, rep Row 2 twice and change to B in last st of Row 10.

Rep Rows 3-10 until piece measures about 19 in. (48.5 cm) from beginning, end with a Row 4 or a Row 8 as the last row you work.

Fasten off and cut yarn, leaving a long yarn tail.

FINISHING

Sew short ends of piece together to make a tube. Thread yarn tail into blunt needle, then weave needle in and out of sts at end of tube. Pull to close opening, then knot for top of Hat.

Weave in ends.
