WIRE WRAPPING 101 - MAKE A LINK BRACELET

## LEARN THESE JEWELRY MAKING TECHNIQUES:

Learn how to make a simple loop, how to make a wrapped loop, and how to connect loops together in a chain to make a bracelet. Finish your bracelet with a hook clasp make out of a single piece of wire.


- Materials:
- Artistir Wire®. Silver 7) Ganıge Item \# 10193634

- Assorted Jump Rings by Bead Landing ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Item \# 10697747
- permanent marker
- Jewelry Pliers Tool Set by Bead Landing™ Item \# 10334538
- Beadalon ${ }^{\ominus}$ Nipper Tool Item \# 10302215
- Beadalon ${ }^{\oplus}$ Nylon Jaw Flat Nose Pliers Item \# 10157928
- Bead Landing ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Triple Bail Forming Pliers Item \# 10223254
- Gold Half Faceted Glass Rondelle Beads by Bead Landing ${ }^{\text {rM }}$ Item \# 10594120
- Labradorite Nugget Beads, 20mm by Bead Landing ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ Item \# 10685872


## Instructions:

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Use the permanent marker to mark a line on both jaws of the round nose pliers about $1 / 2$ way between the tips and the joint. This will help make sure that your loops are consistently sized.
STEP 1
Use the Nylon Jaw Pliers to straighten the end of the 22 Gauge Artistic Wire and cut a piece about 4 inches ( 10 cm )
long.
STEP 2
Make a wrapped Loop. Trim and use the Chain Nose Pliers to tuck in the end.
STEP 3
String on one 8 mm rondel, one labradorite cube, and one 8 mm rondel. Make a wrapped loop on the wire tail. Trim and use Chain Nose Pliers to tuck in the end.

STEP 4
Begin your next wrapped loop, but before closing the wrap, link it into the loop on your first wrapped component. STEP 5
Repeat Step 3 and 4 until your bracelet is about 1.5 inch ( 38 mm ) shorter than the finished size.
STEP 6
Use the Triple Bail Forming Pliers to make a hook clasp. Add it with jump rings to either side of your bracelet.

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
