Needles, Feet and Stitches - Oh My!

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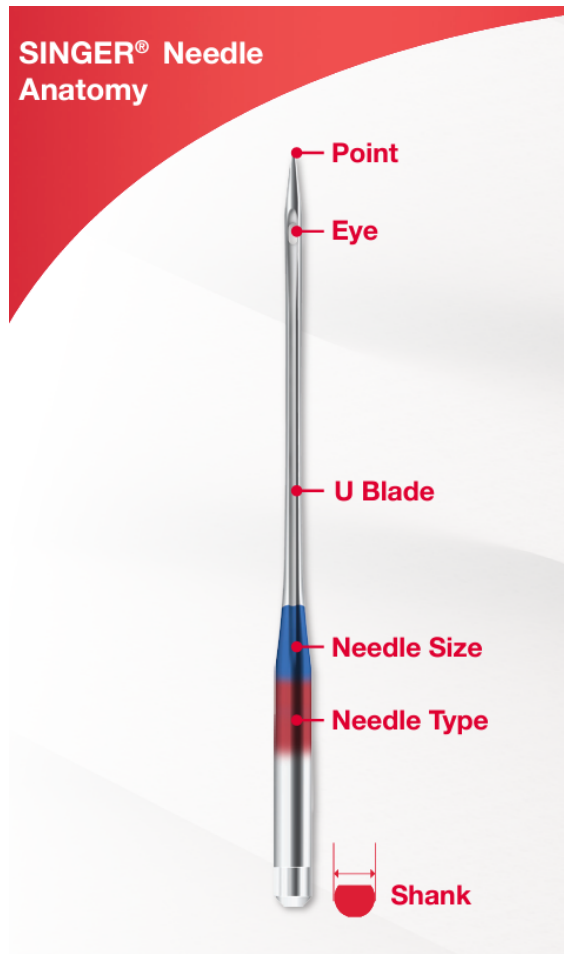


Have you ever wondered why there are so many different types of needles for your sewing machine? What about the reasons for the extra presser feet that either came with your machine or you see for purchase?


This class will go through what the difference is between needle types and size and explain why it is important to use the correct needle for the stitch and fabric you are working with. We will also talk about presser feet. For great results you should use the proper presser foot for the fabric and stitch chosen. If time allows, we'll show some of those optional feet that make your sewing so much easier.

Style of Needle vs Size of Needle



1. Universal Needles - Size 80/12, 90/14, 110/16, 110/18

UNIVERSAL	
	Woven, Natural, Synthetic Fabrics Easily slips through weave of knits and woven fabric with rounded tip and tapered end

2. Ball Point Needles - Size 80/12, 90/14, 100/16

BALL POINT



Knit Fabrics

Designed to slide between the yarns of knit fabrics without snagging with a rounded tip

3. Denim Needles, Leather, Heavy Duty

DENIM



Extra Thick Fabric

Reduces breakage and skip stitches with a sharp point and reinforced blade

LEATHER



Heavy Leather, Vinyl

Cuts through leather and other heavy non-woven imitation leathers and suedes without creating large holes due to the needles wedge shape slightly sharp cutting point

4. Specialty - Quilting, Titanium, Embroidery, Overlock, Twin

5. Button Sewing Foot



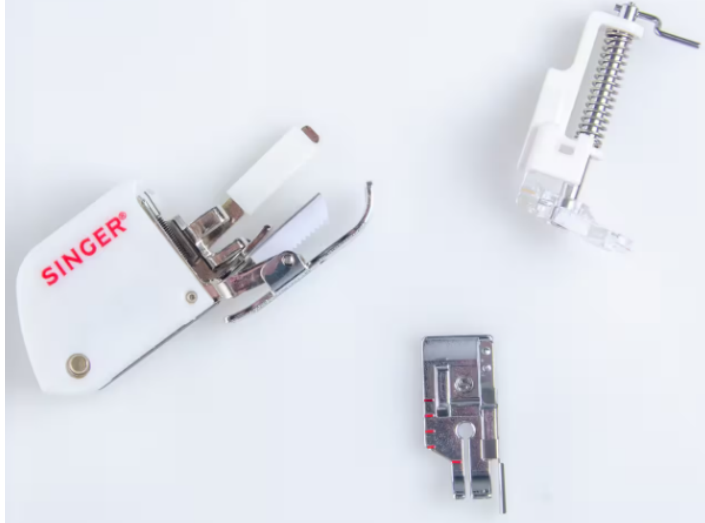
6. Blind Hem Foot

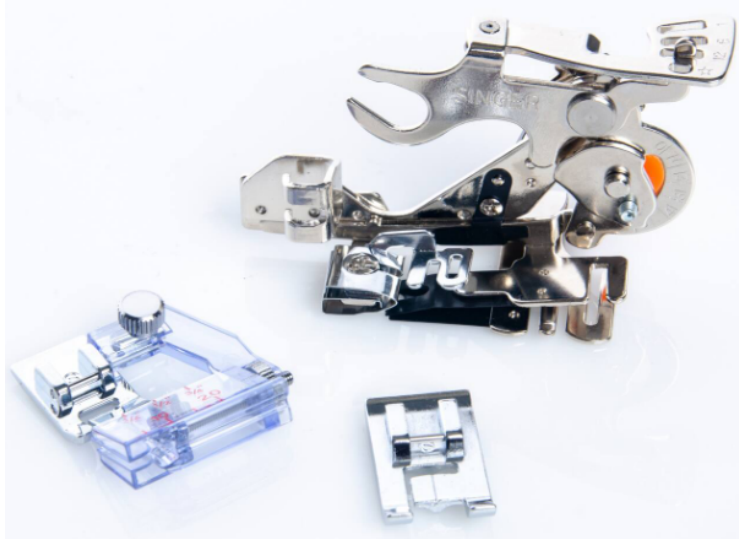
