- 136-099 Lion Brand <u>Heartland Yarn:</u> Dry <u>Tortugas</u>
  1 Ball (A)
- 136-126 <u>Lion Brand</u> <u>Heartland Yarn: Sequoia</u> 1 Ball (B)
- Lion Brand Crochet Hook - Size J-10 (6 mm)
- <u>Lion Brand Large-Eye</u> <u>Blunt Needles (Set of 6)</u>

\*<u>Heartland</u> (Article #136). **Solids:** 100% Acrylic **Tweeds:** 94% Acrylic, 6% Rayon; package size: **Solids:** 5oz/142g (251yd/230m) **Tweeds:** 4oz/113g (200yd/183m)



## GAUGE:

1 ripple = about 3 in. (7.5 cm) measured from peak to peak.

When you match the <u>gauge</u> in a pattern, your project will be the size specified in the pattern and the materials specified in the pattern will be sufficient. The needle or hook size called for in the pattern is based on what the designer used, but it is not unusual for gauge to vary from person to person. If it takes you fewer stitches and rows to make your swatch, try using a smaller size hook or needles; if more stitches and rows, try a larger size hook or needles.

Making a Gauge Swatch

#### **STITCH EXPLANATION:**

**dc2tog (dc 2 sts together)** (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop, yarn over and draw through 2 loops) twice, yarn over and draw through all 3 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

**hdc2tog (hdc 2 sts together)** (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook – 1 st decreased.

#### NOTES:

1. Cowl is made from a rectangle worked in a ripple pattern. Short ends of rectangle are sewn together to make Cowl. A round of edging is worked around the upper and lower edges of the seamed Cowl.


2. This project is worked in a ripple crochet pattern. The ripple pattern is easy to do, but it's

important to remember that you may need to work several rows before the ripple pattern becomes clear.

3. The ripple in this design is created by working (dc2tog) twice or (hdc2tog) twice to form 'valleys' and working (2 dc in each of next 2 sts) or (2 hdc in each of next 2 sts) to form 'peaks'. In each row, take care to work (dc2tog) twice or (hdc2tog) twice over each 'valley' and (2 dc in each of next 2 sts) or (2 hdc in each of next 2 sts) in the 2 sts at center of each 'peak.'

4. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Do not fasten off old color until instructed. Carry color not in use up side of piece, twisting the yarns every RS row to prevent long loops.

#### COWL

With A, ch 39.

**Row 1:** Dc in 4th ch from hook (3 skipped ch count as first dc), dc in next 3 ch, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 ch, \*2 dc in in each of next 2 ch, dc in next 3 ch, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 ch; rep from \* to last ch, 2 dc in last ch – 3 ripples.

**Row 2:** With A, ch 3 (counts as first dc), turn, working in back loops only, dc in first st, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts; rep from \* to beg ch, 2 dc in top of beg ch and change to B in last st.

**Rows 3 and 4:** With B, ch 2 (counts as first hdc), turn, working in back loops only, hdc in first st, hdc in next 3 sts, (hdc2tog) twice, hdc in next 3 sts, \*2 hdc in each of next 2 sts, hdc in next 3 sts, (hdc2tog) twice, hdc in next 3 sts; rep from \* to beg ch, 2 hdc in top of beg ch and change to A in last st of Row 4. **Rows 5 and 6:** With A, ch 3 (counts as dc), turn, working in back loops only, dc in first st, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 3 sts, \*2 dc in top of beg ch and change to B in last st of Row 6.

Rows 7-78: Rep Rows 3-6 eighteen more times.

Rows 79 and 80: Rep Rows 3 and 4.

Fasten off.

#### FINISHING

Sew short ends of rectangle together to make Cowl.

## Edging

From right side, join A with sc anywhere along one edge of Cowl.

Working over the carried yarn strands to hide them, sc evenly around; join with slip st in first sc. Fasten off.

Rep edging around opposite edge of Cowl.

Weave in ends.
