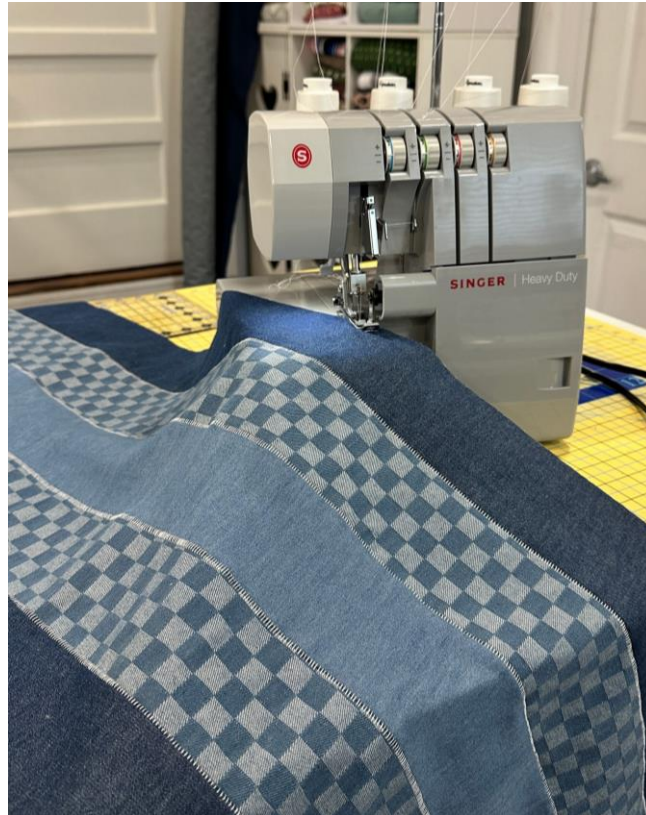

Make Your Own Fabric with a Serger

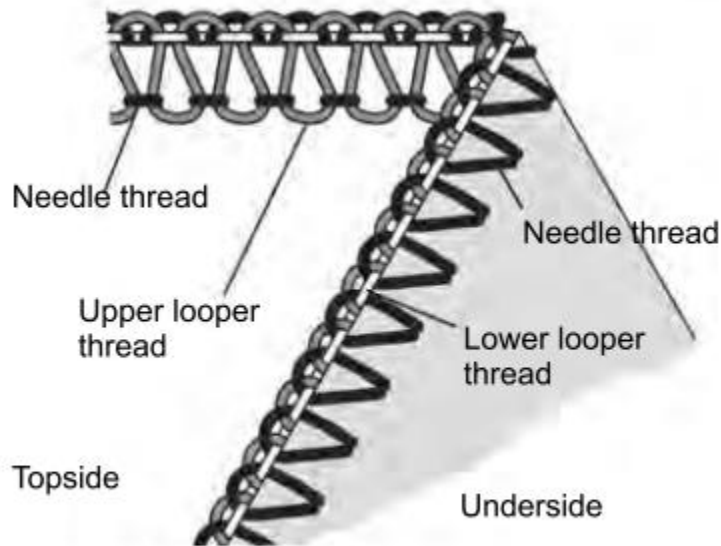


Do you have beautiful fabric scraps laying around you just don't know what to do with but don't want them to go to waste? How about turning them into a one-of-a-kind new fabric you can use to make something new! In this demonstration you will learn how to use the flat locking stitch on a serger to turn your scraps into a fabric. From there the project is your choice of what to make with your new scrappy fabric.

1. 3-Thread Flatlock



Setting up your serger for the 3-thread flatlock stitch:

1. Remove the left needle so only the right needle is threaded
2. Your tension should be set to the following:(left to right)
 Left Needle: (not being used)
 Right Needle: 0
 Upper Looper: 3
 Lower Looper 6

Always test your stitch settings with a scrap piece of fabric prior to working on your project and make adjustments to tension as needed based on the type of fabric you are using.
