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Create these adorable flower studs with us! In class we will guide you through peyote and brick stitch techniques to follow an easy pattern. We will finish up using jewel glue to attach earring posts for a fast and fabulous earring style!


In this document, we will use the following abbreviations:

D11 - Miyuki Delica Size 11

Pattern Chart - In class we will complete the entire pattern from start to finish.




### Step 1

Working with 55 inches of beading thread, leaving a 30 inch tail, use single-column peyote stitch to complete the widest row and the row above, as follows:



## Step 2

Referring to the pattern chart, brick stitch the pattern rows above. Select the first bead in the pattern row. Needle under the first thread bridge. Come up through that bead. String the next bead in the row. Needle under the next thread bridge and come up through that bead. Repeat to the end of the row, and for the row above. Tip: using a ruler or post-it can help guide you in the pattern.



## Step 3 - Complete the top row

Weave down through the next bead and up through the next to exit from the third bead in from the edge. Brick stitch the (4)D11 in Color A that make up the top row.

## Step 4

Using the tail thread, work the remaining pattern down from the starting row. On the third row down, you will encounter an increase. To accomplish this, string the first two beads of that row and needle under the first thread bridge. Come up through the second bead. Brick stitch the rest of the row as normal. Brick stitch the remaining rows, which are all decreases. In the second-to-last row, weave in one bead to exit from the second, then brick stitch the first bead into the second thread bridge.



## Step 5

Weave in remaining working and tail threads and trim. Apply a small amount of glue to the flat side of the earring post. Press it down onto the flower. Allow to dry for 12 hours or per glue manufacturer's instructions.

Finish with earring clutches to wear!
