SUPPLY LIST

Kit includes: Cream Wool×1 White Wool×2 Black Wool×1 Pink Wool×1 Yellow Wool×1 Instructions Additional supplies needed: felting Needle, scissors, thick foam block or sponge, silicone finger tip covers to protect fingers.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Before starting, read all the instructions and prepare the necessary tools. Wear silicone finger tip covers to avoid accidental injuries.

INSTRUCTIONS





Take some white wool, pull, roll and poke it into a rough ball to use as the head of the mouse.





Take your foam pad and needle, poke the white wool, starting at the outside of the coil, push the needle into the wool, and continue around the entire coil, poking into a solid spherical shape.





Take some more white wool, pull, roll and poke it into a larger oval shape, which will be the body of the mouse.





Attach the head to the body, and secure the connection by poking it tightly with a needle.





Take out a small amount of white wool, pull and roll it into arms. The arm is a long strip, one end of which is stamped solid and the other end is not tight, for connecting with the body.





Poke the arm and the body together with a needle and make it into a mouse arm.





After all the limbs and body being connected, to add details to the mouse, starting with the face, paying attention to its pointed nose and mouth.





Take a small amount of pink wool, pull, roll and mold the hands and feet of the mouse. Pay attention to the separation of fingers and toes.





Poke hands and feet together with the body.





Take a small amount of pink wool and poke it into the tip of the nose, forming an inverted triangle for the mouse's nose.





Take a small amount of black wool and poke it into the eye socket of the head, slowly wind it into small balls and poke it tightly to make the eye of the mouse, and make another eye in the same way.





Ears: Take a small amount of pink wool and poke it into two small oblate circles.





Fold the part of the ear in half slightly, and tightly connect to the head.





Tail: Take a small amount of pink wool and shape it into long

Stick the tail into the mouse'ship.





Take a small amount of pink wool and poke it onto the mouse's cheeks with a needle to add a bit of detail.





Take an appropriate amount of yellow wool, pull, roll and mold it into a triangular shape.



Slowly shape the wool with a needle into a tight triangular cheese shape.





Poke the holes in the cheese with a needle.





Put the cheese on the chest of the mouse and poke the cheese and the mouse tightly.





Finish.



TIPS & TRICKS

- 1. Stab vertically to compress the wool.
- 2. Stab at 45 degree angle to attach 2 items together.
- 3. Stab horizontally or 180 degrees to blend 2 pieces together. Remember to leave some untied wool at the joined end so that the two pieces of wool can be tightly connected together.
- 4. The barbed needle compresses the wool fibers together. Stab the needle into the wool slowly. Ensure the needle goes through all layers of wool, but not too deep into the pad.
- 5. Change the side you're felting often to avoid felting into the pad.
- 6. If there is a lump, or the wool is not smooth, continue to stab the wool. When trying to form a shape, stab to compress the wool into the shape.
- 7. Use foam as a work surface for safety. Needles should always be straight up and down to avoid being bent or broken.
- 8. For safety, keep fingers away from needle points.

WARNINGS

CHOKING HAZARD.
