SUPPLY LIST

Kit includes: Green Wool×1 Brown Wool×1 Blue Wool×1 Pink Wool×1 Ginger Wool×2 Light Yellow Wool×1 Light Brown Wool×1 Instructions

Additional supplies needed: felting Needle, scissors, thick foam block or sponge, silicone finger tip covers to protect fingers.

BEFORE YOU BEGIN

Before starting, read all the instructions and prepare the necessary tools. Wear silicone finger tip covers to avoid accidental injuries.

INSTRUCTIONS






Pink flower: Take out some pink wool.

Tip: It only needs to hold its shape and use the needle to poke it into a petal shape.






Poke the needle into the wool and constantly adjust the direction. Continue to repeat the above steps until you poke into the shape of the petals, you can leave a tuft of wool at the bottom to better hold the petals together.

Repeat steps 1-2 to make a total of 5 pink petals.





Take a small amount of blue wool, roll it into a ball, and refine the pattern as described in step 2 to create the shape of the flower's center.





Place the tuft of wool left at the bottom of the flower in the center position and fix the flower with a poke pin. 6



Then fix core at the center of the flower.





Yellow flowers: Take the appropriate light yellow wool as the petals, take a small amount of light brown wool as the flower core, follow steps 1-6, make light yellow flowers.



Vase: Take some ginger wool, pull and roll it into a vase shape.



Take some brown wool, pull long strips and poke the branches with the appropriate length to make 2 branches.





Fix the two flowers and the stem in the vase in sequence.





Leaves: Take some green wool and pull and roll them into a leaf shape, and add a small amount of brown wool to the end of the leaf to better bind the stems and leaves together. Repeat the above steps to make 2 leaves.





Poke the leaves to the branches. Finish.

TIPS & TRICKS

- 1. Stab vertically to compress the wool.
- 2. Stab at 45 degree angle to attach 2 items together.
- 3. Stab horizontally or 180 degrees to blend 2 pieces together. Remember to leave some untied wool at the joined end so that the two pieces of wool can be tightly connected together.
- 4. The barbed needle compresses the wool fibers together. Stab the needle into the wool slowly. Ensure the needle goes through all layers of wool, but not too deep into the pad.
- 5. Change the side you're felting often to avoid felting into the pad.
- 6. If there is a lump, or the wool is not smooth, continue to stab the wool. When trying to form a shape, stab to compress the wool into the shape.
- 7. Use foam as a work surface for safety. Needles should always be straight up and down to avoid being bent or broken.
- 8. For safety, keep fingers away from needle points.

WARNINGS

CHOKING HAZARD.
