## LION BRAND® THE COTTONY ONE STRIPED DICKIE



EASY
SIZE
Finished Width About 15 in. ( 38 cm )
Finished Length About 13 in . $(33 \mathrm{~cm}$ )
MATERIALS

- LION BRAND® THE COTTONY ONE (Art. \#3040)
\#122 Marvellous Mushroom 2 balls (A)
\#126 Hot Chocolate 1 ball (B)
- LION BRAND® large-eyed blunt needle


## ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Crochet hook size H-8 (5 mm)

## GAUGE

12 hdc +9 rows = about 4 in . $(10 \mathrm{~cm})$.
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

## STITCH EXPLANATION

hdc2tog (hdc 2 sts together) (Yarn over, insert hook in next st and draw up a loop) twice, yarn over and draw through all 5 loops on hook - 1 st decreased.

## NOTES

1. Dickie is worked in 2 pieces; Body and Turtleneck.
2. Front of Dickie is worked from lower front edge up to shoulders then piece is divided and shoulders are worked separately to form neck opening. Piece is then joined again to work back down to lower back edge.
3. Turtleneck is worked separately and then sewn into neck opening.
4. Yarn color is changed to form stripes. To change yarn color, work last st of old color to last yarn over. Yarn over with new color and draw through all loops on hook to complete st. Proceed with new color. Fasten off old color.

## DICKIE

With A, ch 45.
Row 1 (RS): With A, sc in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across - you will have 44 sc in this row.
Rows 2-4: With A, ch 2 (does not count as a st in this row and all following rows), turn, hdc in each st across; change to B in last st of Row 4.
Rows 5 and 6: With B, ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.
Row 7 (Increase Row): With B, ch 2, turn, 2 hdc in first st, hdc in each st to last st, 2 hdc in last st; change to $A$ in last st -46 hdc.
Rows 8-11: With $A$, ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across; change to B in last st of Row 11.
Rows 12: With $B$, ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.
Row 13: With B, rep Row $7-48$ hdc.
Row 14: With $B$, ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across; change to $A$ in last st.
Work remainder of piece with A only.
Rows 15-18: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.
Row 19: Rep Row $7-50$ hdc.
Rows 18-24: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across

## Divide for Neck Opening

## Left Shoulder

Row 25 (RS): Ch 2, turn, hdc in first 16 sts, hdc2tog; leave last 32 sts unworked for neck and right shoulder - 17 hdc.
Row 26: Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each st across - 16 hdc.
Row 27: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc2tog - 15 hdc.
Rows 28 and 29: Rep Rows 26 and 27 - 13 hdc in Row 29.
Fasten off.

## Right Shoulder

Row 25 (RS): From RS, skip next 14 sts following last st of Row 25 of left shoulder, join A with sl st in next st, ch 1, beg in same st as joining, hdc2tog, hdc in each st across 17 hdc.
Row 26: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc2tog - 16 hdc.
Row 27: Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each next st to end - 15 hdc.
Rows 28 and 29: Rep Rows 26 and 27 - 13 hdc in Row 29.
Do not fasten off.
Rejoin Shoulders at Back Neck
Row 30: Ch 2, turn, hdc in 13 sts of right shoulder, ch 24 for back neck, hdc in 13 sts of left shoulder.

## Back

Row 31 (RS): Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st and ch across - 50 hdc.
Rows 32-42: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.
Row 43 (Decrease Row): Ch 2, turn, hdc2tog, hdc in each st to last 2 sts, hdc2tog - 48 hdc
Rows 44-46: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.
Rows 47-54: Rep Rows 43-46 twice - 44 hdc when all decreases have been completed.
Rows 55-58: Ch 2, turn, hdc in each st across.
Fasten off.

## TURTLENECK

With B, ch 28.
Row 1: Hdc in 3rd ch (2 skipped ch do not count as a st) from hook and each ch across - 26 hdc.

Row 2: Ch 2 (does not counts as a st), turn, working in back loops only, hdc in each st to last st; working in both loops, hdc in last st.
Rep Row 2 until piece measures about 21 in . 53.5 cm ) from beg.
Fasten off, leaving a long tail for sewing Turtleneck.

## FINISHING

Sew short edges of Turtleneck together to form a ring.
Sew one edge of Turtleneck ring into neck opening.
Fold top half of Turtleneck down.
Weave in ends.
